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## Parent Notification of Noblesville Schools' Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)

Noblesville Schools provides the highest quality of education for every student. Our school uses a tiered approach to instruction, called Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS), to ensure all students achieve their highest potential. This structure provides the necessary support for all students to achieve their learning and behavioral goals.

MTSS is designed to provide various levels of support for students to experience academic, social, and emotional success. All students receive core instruction (Tier 1) that is responsive to each student's learning needs. If a student needs additional support to ensure success, then students are provided Tier 2 followed by Tier 3, if deemed appropriate. Both tiers provide additional assistance beyond core instruction (Tier 1). All students are assessed and progress is continually monitored to guide instructional decisions and help each child feel success within the core curriculum (Tier 1). Parents will be notified as students are provided Tier 2 and Tier 3 supplemental supports.

- **Tier 1** – Teachers design and customize purposeful grade level core instruction to meet the needs of all students within the general education classroom.
- **Tier 2** – Based on student data, students needing an additional emphasis on literacy, mathematics, and/or behavioral instruction are provided supplemental, evidence-based strategies/interventions that meet their specific learning needs. An instructional support team tracks each student's progress, and parents/guardians receive updates on child's performance.
- **Tier 3**– Students needing additional support beyond Tier 2 are provided strategic supports in Tier 3 to meet their individual learning needs. Tier 3 provides additional time for learning through strategic supports. After Tier 3 implementation, students who continue to display limited growth may then be considered for further evaluation and services. ☐
