FAQ: When do the children clip up or down on their behavior calendars?



On our behavior calendars, all students start the day on Ready to Learn (green). Students' choices throughout the day are then reflected in their clips up and/or down. Students clip up when they: help someone in need; do amazingly good work; show that they are really trying hard; get compliments from another teacher; are the first ones to follow the teacher's directions; show responsibility by, for example, remembering to sign in for lunch or give me his/her homework folder; or make other good choices. Students clip down when they: interrupt learning by blurting things out; are disrespectful; distract others from learning; fail to follow directions in a timely manner; get in trouble in a Specials or TIPS class; goof around in the hallway or bathroom; or make other choices like these.
